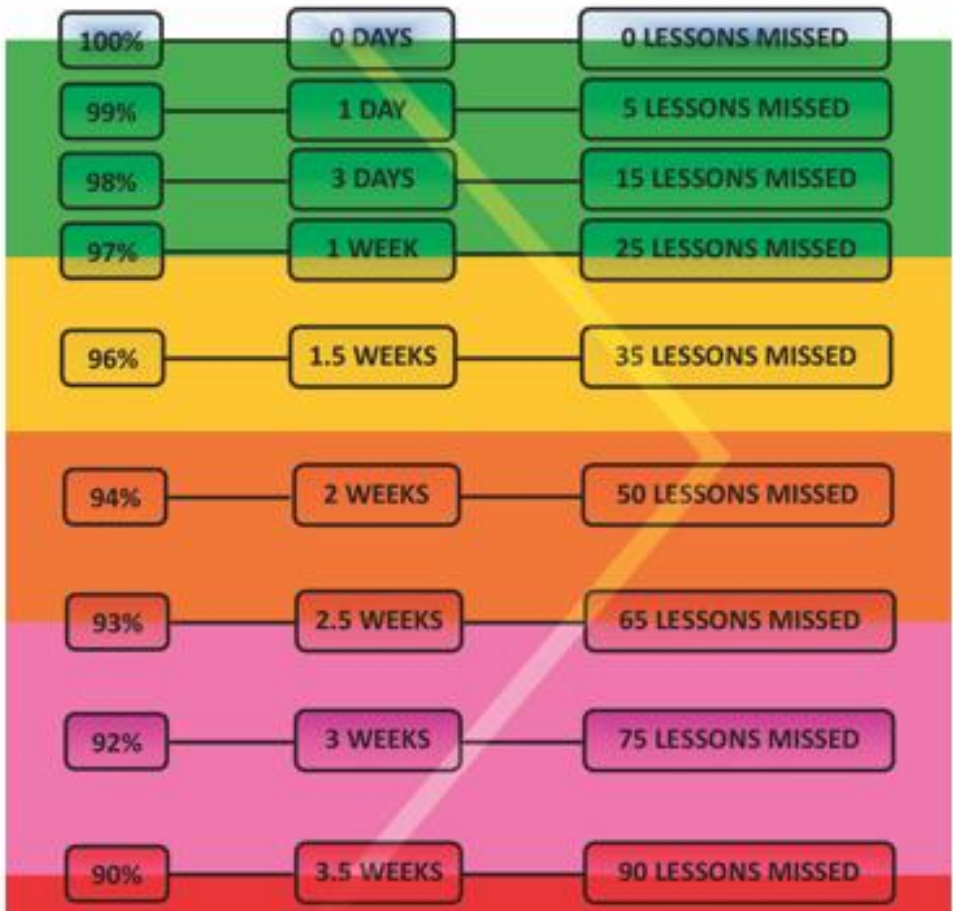
Attendance Diamond
